4.1. Introduction of New Member, Jaime Gunderson

Jaime Gunderson introduced herself to the Committee, noting that she has been a health and substance use counselor in Mayville since 2021.

4.2. Presentation on Health Hub

Presenter: Jess Loomans - TAG Center Director

TAG Director Looman provided an overview of the Health Hub program at the TAG Center. She indicated it is a preventative health and wellness offering and provided an overview of what it all encompasses. She also updated them that senior meals is moving to the TAG Center. She also explained she is working with Karen Greenwald with Dodge County for other offerings, such as a Strong Bodies program. They are looking to find ways to offer proactive services, such as a "try it" day or health fair. She took questions from the body, explaining it is yet to be seen if Health Hub will be a reoccurring program.

4.3. Discussion Regarding Outreach from Watertown Regional Medical Center

Mayor Boelk provided background for this agenda item, explaining that Watertown Regional Medical Center had reached out to the City, expressing interest in opening a clinic. However, Watertown Regional has since made contact with SSM and SSM is not interested in renting their clinic, so Watertown Regional is no longer pursuing coming to Mayville.

4.4. Discuss, with Possible Action, Next Steps with Nexus Health Connect and Aambe

Alan Williams explained he has an upcoming call this week with Nexus and Aambe, and will update the body with any information received. At this time, he does know that Aambe is attempting to get the support of the Ho-Chunk tribe in Wisconsin. If that does not work, Nexus will still work with us to try to pursue other health care options.

4.5. Discussion on Health Care Model of Oak Street Health

Ald. Olson indicated she is having difficulty making contact with anyone from Oak Street Health, but from what she has found, she does not believe they are yet in Wisconsin.

4.6. Discussion on Health Care Model of Community Health Clinic and Accompanying Outreach to UW Health and Noble

Alan Williams informed the body he is having difficulty making contact with anyone from the Community Health Clinic through UW Health and Noble. He does know that they serve under-privileged communities.

4.7. Update on Outreach to Dr. Miller

Alan Williams informed the body he has made outreach to Dr. Miller to inform them of this Committee and its objectives, stressing the Committee is looking to add to services in the City and not harm his business. Dr. Miller has been busy and has not yet responded.

4.8. Discuss, with Possible Action, Community Health Outreach and Education Ideas

Mayor Boelk informed the body of the radon testing kits now available at the library in Mayville. There was discussion on a Safe Home Awareness event, National EMS week, a health fair, as well as Alan Williams upcoming interview with WEBV radio regarding this Committee.
