Minutes – Residence (Sex Offender) Board Meeting, August 12, 2024

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 6:00PM by Mayor Rob Boelk, with the following roll call:
Present: Ald. Bob Smith, Ald. Michael Schmidt, Ald. Jesse Liebenow, Ald. Ken Neumann, and Ald. Kim Olson.

Excused: Ald. DeBaker

Absent: None

Staff Present: City Attorney Patrick Madden, Police Chief Ryan Toellner, Police Lieutenant Jeremy Johnson, and Clerk Anastasia Gonstead.

Overview of Petition Process and Meeting Procedures by City Attorney

Attorney Madden provided the Board and those in attendance an overview of the process and an explanation that if the Board votes to waive the requirements of the ordinance, he would advise they make clear findings for the record and the waiver should be based on reliable, verified information.

Citizen Comment

Jared Linskens, 427 Willow Circle – He urged the Board to uphold the ordinance and provided examples of negative experiences he and his children have had with the petitioner.

Keri Solis, 455 N Walnut Street – She provided the Board with examples of negative experiences she and her children have had with the petitioner, which has resulted in police interaction.

Report from Petitioner, Tabitha Krukowski

Ms. Krukowski began her report making comments regarding one of the citizen speakers. Mayor Boelk informed Ms. Krukowski she needed to speak to the agenda item and refrain from talking about her neighbor. Ms. Krukowski provided the Board her reasons she believes she should be granted a waiver to reside at 424 Dayton Street, including her pregnancy, disabilities, and that she intends to obtain residence outside of Dodge County within 60 days.

Report from Mayville Police Department

Police Chief Ryan Toeller addressed the Board. He provided a timeline of events that led to this meeting as well as an overview of the proximity Ms. Krukowski is to various prohibited locations if allowed to reside at 424 Dayton Street. He went on to explain recidivism in sexual offenders and the numerous community contacts he has received in opposition to Ms. Krukowski remaining at her current address.

Discussion, Deliberation, and Action on Appeal

Attorney Madden asked clarifying questions of Ms. Krukowski pertaining to her pregnancy, disability, and Court-ordered classes. The only matter Ms. Krukowski was able to provide proof of validity to was her pregnancy.

Ald. Olson inquired of Ms. Krukowski if the housing she plans to have within 60 days is finalized. Ms. Krukowski explained it was not yet finalized and gave an overview of where she is at with that.

The motion that that City of Mayville Code Section 357-3 be upheld was made by Ald. Neumann and seconded by Ald. Schmidt.

Discussion: None

A roll vote was taken – Ald. Neumann – aye, Ald. Schmidt – aye, Ald. Smith – aye, Ald. Liebenow – aye, Ald. Olson – aye. Vote – 5 ayes, 0 nays. Motion carried.

Adjournment

The motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Ald. Neumann and seconded by Ald. Liebenow.

Vote – 5 ayes, 0 nays. Motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 6:20PM.
